Previously: Millennium Development Goals 2000-2015

Adoption in 2015 (all 193 UN member states)

Extensive consultation: working groups, CSOs, countries, public participation etc.

International responsibiliy

17 Sustainable Development Goals & 169 targets

"Leave no one behind"




















































































About the 2030 Agenda

3 dimensions: economic, social, environmental

Integrated approach:

Shift to cross-sectoral, multi-level perspective

Focus on interconnectedness

Criticism and achievements

- Economic goal(s) based on growth
- Lack of precise definitions, indicators
- Trade-offs between goals

However:

- Agreement achieved Compromise/trade-offs natural
- Different application open definitions
- Despite flaws: important global plan with shared responsibility

Sustainable Development and COVID-19

Aggravated economic, ecological and social challenges

- → restructure and "Build Back Better" with the 2030 Agenda:
- Change consumption and production patterns
- Reinforced focus on Climate, biodiversity, natural habitats
- Reduce inequalities

Goal: resilient environment, society and economy to withstand further crises

- 2030 Agenda in government program 2020–2024
- Inter-ministerial working group (IMAG)
- July 2020: 1st Voluntary National Review (VNR)
- Need for: SDG budgeting + "SDG checks" for laws and strategies
